
The book's unnamed protagonist, who feels neither male nor female, is prompted by their grandmother's slide into dementia to investigate their family history. The more their grandmother forgets, the more the narrator tries to remember: what was it in their childhood that prompted them to feel so alienated from their body? Does it have something to do with the family's hushed-up history of incest? Why is their grandmother struggling to differentiate between herself and her sister who died young? And what happened to their youngest great aunt who disappeared when she was young. Tracking down answers to these questions proves difficult because the family has a habit of keeping quiet about such matters. At the heart of it all is the question of self-determination: how to exist when your own body is never a given, but is instead constantly having to be negotiated?

Singular in its style and form, Bloodbook deals with our intangible heritage, the things we carry without being asked: stories, genders, identities, trauma, languages, class affiliations. Kim de l'Horizon searches for other kinds of knowledge and traditions, other stories and ways of becoming: feminist, witchy, bought with blood, and those that leave a hole in their wake.

Eilis Lacey is Irish, married to Tony Fiorello, a plumber and one of four Italian American brothers, all of whom live in neighboring houses on a cul-de-sac in Lindenhurst, Long Island, with their wives and children and Tony's parents, a huge extended family. It is the spring of 1976 and Eilis is now forty with two teenage children. Though her ties to Ireland remain stronger than those that hold her to her new land and home, she has not returned in decades.

One day, when Tony is at work an Irishman comes to the door asking for Eilis by name. He tells her that his wife is pregnant with Tony's child and that when the baby is born, he will not raise it but instead deposit it on Eilis's doorstep. It is what Eilis does – and what she refuses to do – in response to this stunning news that makes Tóibín's novel so riveting and suspenseful.


Alongside a limited selection of excerpts from the works of poets whose writings have been published separately (Homer, Hesiod, Pindar, the tragic poets, and Aristophanes), the book brings together the finest creations of lyric poets from the Archaic and Classical periods (Archilochus, Sappho, Alcaeus, Anacreon, Simonides, and others), elegy poets (Solon, Theognis, Tyrtaeus, Semonides, and more), the poetry of thinkers (Parmenides, Empedocles, Xenophanes), Athenian drinking songs, and Orphic poetry. Additionally, it includes selections from the works of Hellenistic poets: Theocritus, Callimachus, Apollonius of Rhodes, Herodas, and others; a broad selection of excerpts from the works of ancient and Hellenistic comedic poets; and selections from the works of epigram writers, from Simonides to the Hellenistic epigrammatists.

Palestine 1936

The Great Revolt and the Roots of the Middle East Conflict

A gripping, profoundly human, yet even-handed narrative of the origins of the Middle East conflict, with enduring resonance and relevance for our time.

The 1936–1939 revolt was the crucible in which Palestinian identity coalesced, uniting rival families, city and country in a single struggle for independence. Yet the rebellion would ultimately turn on itself, shredding the social fabric, sidelining pragmatists in favor of extremists, and propelling waves of refugees from their homes. British forces' aggressive counterinsurgency took care of the rest, finally quashing the uprising on the eve of World War II. The revolt to end Zionism had instead crushed the Arabs themselves, leaving them crippled in facing the Jews' own drive for statehood a decade later.

This is the story of two national movements and the first sustained confrontation between them. The rebellion was Arab, but the Zionist counter-rebellion—the Jews' military, economic, and psychological transformation—is a vital, overlooked element in the chronicle of how Palestine became Israel.

In Oren Kessler's engaging, journalistic voice, it reveals world-changing events through extraordinary individuals on all sides: their loves and their hatreds, their deepest fears and profoundest hopes.

The Story of the Manuscripts That Illuminated the Renaissance

The Renaissance in Florence conjures images of beautiful frescoes and elegant buildings. But equally important for the centuries to follow were geniuses of a different sort: Florence's manuscript hunters, scribes, scholars, and booksellers, who blew the dust off a thousand years of history and, through the discovery and diffusion of ancient knowledge, imagined a new and enlightened world.

At the heart of this activity, was a remarkable man: Vespasiano da Bisticci. Born in 1422, he became "the king of the world's booksellers." At a time when all books were made by hand, Vespasiano produced and sold hundreds of volumes from his bookshop, which also became a gathering spot for debate and discussion. Besides repositories of ancient wisdom by the likes of Plato and , Aristotle. His books were works of art in their own right, copied by talented scribes and illuminated by the finest miniaturists. His clients included popes, kings, and princes across Europe.

He reached the peak of his powers when a new invention appeared: the printed book. By 1480, This epic technological disruption, whereby cheaply produced books reached readers who never could have afforded one of Vespasiano's elegant manuscripts.

Waiting to Be Arrested at Night A Uyghur Poet's Memoir of China's Genocide

One by one, Tahir Hamut Izgil's friends disappeared. The Chinese government's brutal persecution of the Uyghur people had continued for years, but in 2017 it assumed a terrifying new scale. The Uyghurs, a predominantly Muslim minority group in western China, were experiencing an echo of the worst horrors of the twentieth century, amplified by China's establishment.

Tahir, a prominent poet and intellectual, had been no stranger to persecution. After he attempted to travel abroad in 1996, police tortured him until he confessed to fabricated charges and sent him to a re-education through labor camp.

Once Tahir noticed that the park near his home was nearly empty because so many neighbors had been arrested. One night,he placed by his door a sturdy pair of shoes, a sweater, and a coat so that he could stay warm if the police came for him in the middle of the night fleeing the country was the family's only hope.

Waiting to Be Arrested at Night is the story of the political, social, and cultural destruction of Tahir Hamut Izgil's homeland. Among leading Uyghur intellectuals and writers. His book is a call for the world to awaken to the unfolding catastrophe, and a tribute to his friends and fellow Uyghurs whose voices have been silenced.

Set in Jerusalem in the 1930s, with Europe on the brink of war, Agnon's last novel tells the haunting tale of a mature man's obsessive love for a younger woman. At a time when Jewish refugees from Europe are subject to British harassment in Palestine and to daily incidents of Arab violence, Herbst, restless in the face of a false sense of calm pervading the university, tries to fend off the ravages of time and of his age by pitching himself into

a series of fantasies sparked off by Shira, a sensual, freewheeling young woman.

S.Y. Agnon (1888-1970) was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1966, and the Israel Prize in 1954 and 1958. The 23 volumes of his works include, among others, The Bridal Canopy, A Guest for the Night, A Simple Story, Two Tales, and A Book That Was Lost.



"These are parts that belong only to us, and nobody else is allowed to touch them," they said. The mother and her children talk about human private parts, when it is permitted to touch them and when it is not, the difference between a good secret and a bad one, and to whom it is best to turn to for help. This book teaches children how to protect their bodies and their privacy. It explains the rights they have over their bodies and how to avoid possible harm. This important, complex, and sensitive issue is tackled in an easygoing, friendly, and level-headed way, tailored for kindergarten-age children.

Yael Feder is a social worker and trained actress, who writes, directs, and stars in "Yael's Friends," a children's theater group that specializes in youth education shows. My Private Parts Belong To Me is based on the theater production Yael Learns How to Protect Her Body. The show was adapted to a compact disc format called Yael's Friends, which has sold more than 20,000 copies.


